Laboring for Christ-By Ellen G White

Everywhere there are hearts crying out for the living God. Discourses unsatisfying to the hungry soul have been given in the churches. In these discourses there is not that divine manifestation which touches the mind and creates a glow in the soul. The hearers cannot say: "Did not our heart burn within us, while He talked with us by the way, and while He opened to us the Scriptures?" Luke 24:32. Much of the teaching given is powerless to awaken the transgressor or convict souls of sin. The people who come to hear the word need a plain, straightforward presentation of truth. Some who have once tasted of the word of God have dwelt long in an atmosphere where there is no God, and they long for the divine presence.

The very first and most important thing is to melt and subdue the soul by presenting our Lord Jesus Christ as the sin-pardoning Savior. Never should a sermon be preached, or Bible instruction in any line be given, without pointing the hearers to the "Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world." John 1:29. Every true doctrine makes Christ the center, every precept receives force from His words. Keep before the people the cross of Calvary. Show what caused the death of Christ—the transgression of the law. Let not sin be cloaked or treated as a matter of little consequence. It is to be presented as guilt against the Son of God. Then point the people to Christ, telling them that immortality comes only through receiving Him as their personal Savior. Arouse the people to see how far they have departed from the Lord's ordinances by adopting worldly policy and conforming to worldly principles. These have brought them into transgression of God's law.

Many in the world set their affections on things that in themselves are not evil; but they become satisfied with these things, and do not seek the greater and higher good that Christ desires to give them. Now we must not rudely seek to deprive them of what they hold dear. Reveal to them the beauty and preciousness of truth. Lead them to behold Christ in His loveliness; then they will turn from everything that would draw their affections away from Him. This is the principle of the Savior's dealing with men; it is the principle that must be brought into the church.

Christ came into the world to "bind up the broken-hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to them that are bound." Isaiah 61:1. The Sun of Righteousness shall "arise with healing in His wings." Malachi 4:2. The world is full of men and women who are carrying a heavy burden of sorrow and suffering and sin. God sends His children to reveal to them Him who will take away the burden and give them rest. It is the mission of Christ's servants to help, to bless, and to heal.

Christ's favorite theme was the paternal character and abundant love of God. This knowledge of God was Christ's own gift to men, and this gift He has committed to His people to be communicated by them to the world.

Let the message for this time be presented, not in long, labored discourses, but in short talks, right to the point. Do not think when you have gone over a subject once that you can pass right on to other points, and the hearers will retain all that has been presented. There is danger of passing too rapidly from point to point. Give short lessons, in plain, simple language, and let them be often repeated.

Be careful never to lose a sense of the presence of the divine Watcher. Remember that you are speaking, not only before an assembly of men, but before One whom you should ever recognize. Speak as if the whole heavenly universe were before you.

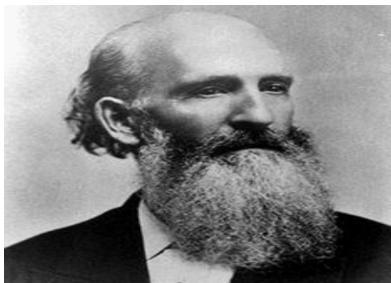

Adventist Pioneers

James Springer White (1821- 1881)



James White was born to Deacon John and Betsey White in Palmyra, Maine on the 4th of August 1821. He was the fifth of nine children and suffered as a boy from weakness of eyesight which prevented him from attending school until he was 19 years old. He studied for 18 hours a day, thus in twelve weeks he attained a certificate indicating his qualifications to teach common branches. The next winter he taught.

At 15 he was baptized in a denomination called Christian Connection to which his parents belonged. He later learnt about the Advent Message from his mother and joined the Mille rites as they confidently await the return of the Lord. He suffered deep disappointment with the other believers in October, 1844 but he continued to cling in confidence to the word of God.

Early in 1845, James became acquainted with Ellen Harmon. A courtship developed and they matured only after they assured themselves that for them to marry was God's providence. They were married on August 30, 1846. Shortly after the young couple read a pamphlet written by Joseph Bates and accepted the Seventh-day Sabbath. The couple had four children, two of whom died at an early age.

Elder White helped to lead "Sabbath Conferences" and worked out several key doctrines of the emerging church. He was also a firm believer in his wife's visions, and when she was shown that he should begin publishing a paper, he began to work on the first of several papers that he founded- The Present Truth, in July 1849. Among other publications to his credit: The Second Advent Review and Sabbath Herald (now Adventist Review) in 1850, The Youth Instructor (now Insight) in 1852, and Signs of the Times in 1874. Both the Pacific Press and the Review and Herald Publishing Association trace their beginning back to James White.

During the first years of his marriage, James and Ellen travelled and preached over a wide area, having no permanent home of their own.

Elder White called for church organization. He helped to establish the General Conference in May, 1863. In spite of illness, including a series of strokes that affected his health and relation to others, he served a total of ten years as General Conference President (1865- 1867, 1869- 1871, 1874- 1880).

He died in Battle Creek on August 6, 1881, of pernicious malarial fever; he was buried in Oak Hill cemetery in the White family plot.

Labor Day Fun Facts

Why was Labor Day invented?

Labor Day came about because workers felt they were spending too many hours and days on the job.

The first Labor Day was celebrated in 1882.

In the 1830s, manufacturing workers were putting in 70-hour weeks on average. Sixty years later, in 1890, hours of work had dropped, although the average manufacturing worker still toiled in a factory 60 hours a week.

These long working hours caused many union organizers to focus on winning a shorter eight-hour work day. They also focused on getting workers more days off, such as the Labor Day holiday, and reducing the workweek to just six days.

These early organizers clearly won since the most recent data show that the average person working in manufacturing is employed for a bit over 40 hours a week and most people work only five days a week.

Surprisingly, many politicians and business owners were actually in favor of giving workers more time off. That's because workers who had no free time were not able to spend their wages on traveling, entertainment or dining out.

As the U.S. economy expanded beyond farming and basic manufacturing in the late 1800s and early 1900s, it became important for businesses to find consumers interested in buying the products and services being produced in ever greater amounts. Shortening the work week was one way of turning the working class into the consuming class.

Average pay of worker in the 1892 was about \$2.59 per day (keep in mind that they typically worked 10 hour days)

Acre of land - \$4-\$40

6 room house \$12.25 per month

Loaf of bread .10 cents

Pound of butter .35 cents

Quart of milk .06 cents

Dozen eggs .40 cents

Pound of sugar .10 cents

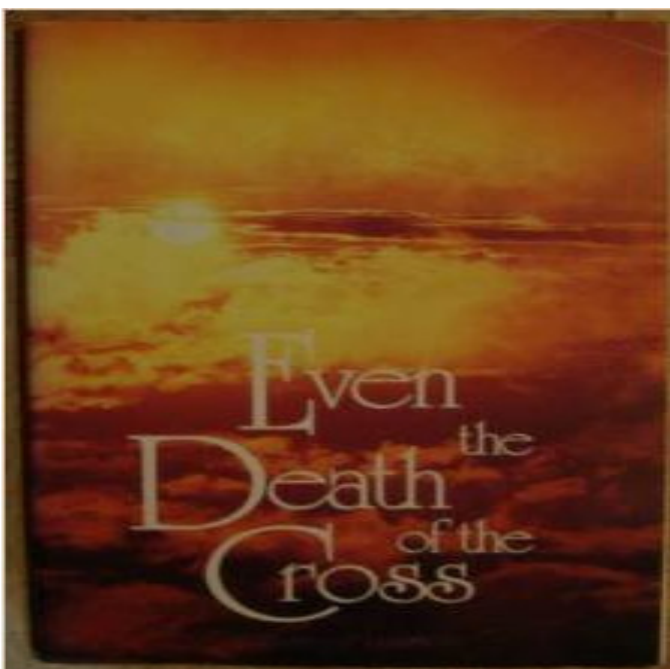
Sabbath September 22nd

September Tip

Plant a fall cover crop blend including at least one nitrogen fixing plant now.

You will protect your soil from winter compaction and erosion, increase soil fertility, improve soil tilth, and cut down on weed germination.

- Watch and treat for woolly aphids on brassicas
- Finish all summer pruning ASAP
- Start a new compost bin if needed
- Examine season extension
- Mulch or cover crop to protect and improve soil

Recipe Corner

Spicy White Bean & Sweet Corn Gazpacho

This raw and flavorful Spicy White Bean & Sweet Corn Gazpacho is perfect for hot summer days when it's too warm to turn the stove on. The protein-packed white beans make it filling enough for a meal or it can be served in shooters for an easy appetizer. / Adapted from The Endless Meal

Course: Appetizer / Main

Servings: 4 servings as a main

Ingredients

- 2 pints sweet yellow tomatoes
- 3 ears of corn (about 1 1/2 cups)
- 1 yellow bell pepper , quartered
- 1/2 of 1 small shallot or 1/2 of 1 small onion , chopped
- 2 tsp . sea salt
- 1 tsp garlic chili paste
- 1 15.5 oz can Great Northern white beans strained and washed
- 1/4 cup sherry vinegar
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 1 Tbsp lemon juice
- Pepper
- Yogurt , for garnish (optional)

Instructions

Add tomatoes, corn, bell peppers, and shallots to a large bowl. Stir in salt and let sit for thirty minutes.

Working in two batches, transfer to a high speed blender along with chili paste, beans, and vinegar. Begin blending and slowly pour the olive oil. Let blend until completely smooth. Season with pepper and more salt (if needed).

Transfer to four bowls and garnish with corn, yogurt, or more olive oil.

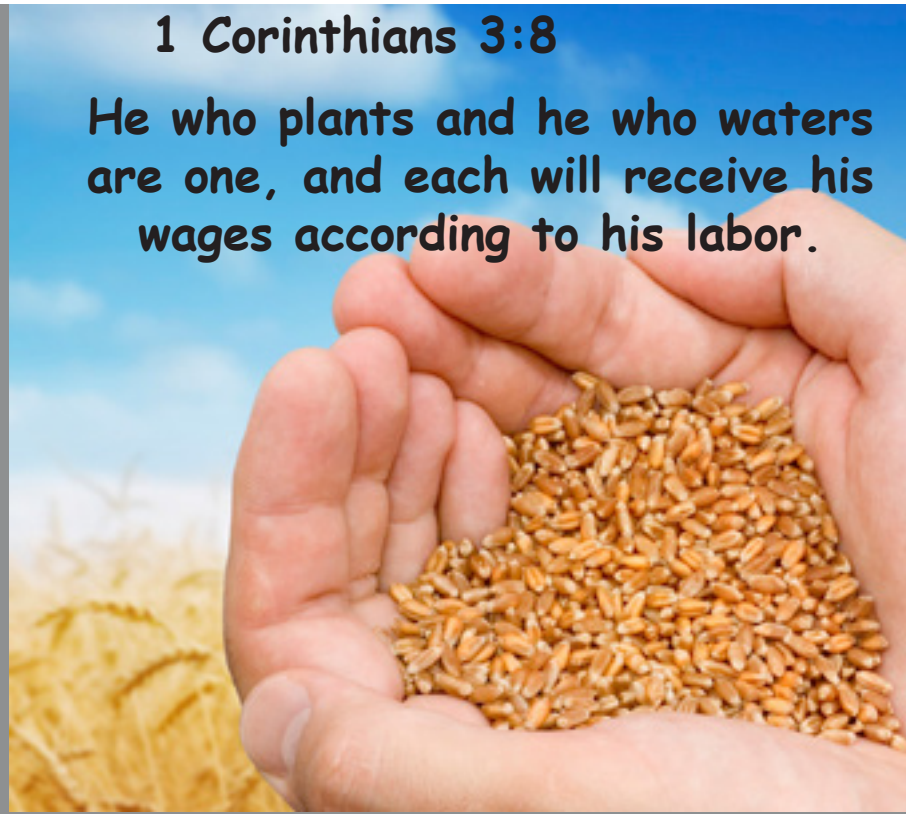
